Is a dedicated conservationist on Banks' Peninsula and Manager of the Rod Donald Banks Peninsula Trust. This trust has recently purchased Te Ahu Pātiki, the two highest peaks on the Banks Peninsula, with the aim to facilitate natural regeneration of native forest, biodiversity and public access. She is a local representative with much grass roots knowledge to share.

Playing the long game....

Suky will discuss the Trust's vision for natural regeneration of forests. She will also share practical knowledge about the Emissions Trading Scheme and her current mission - how to get funding through the Emissions Trading Scheme for native regenerating forests, to support nature and agriculture working together as land-uses.

Nicole is of Māori and English descent with strong whakapapa to local hapū Ngāi Tūāhuriri (Tuahiwi) and Kati Huikai (Port Levy). She is the Managing Partner of Tiaki & Partners with a current focus on renewable energy, Director of Horomaka Limited with a focus on Aquaculture as well as a Trustee of Ōtākaro living labs and holds a number of directorships across Education, Health, Fisheries and Environment.
