









### **FAST FACTS**



- Although New Zealand makes only 1% of the world's wine, it enjoys a stellar reputation.
- Covering 10 degrees of latitude and surrounded by the Pacific Ocean, the climate is mostly cool maritime. No vineyard is more than 130 kilometres (or 80 miles) from the sea.
- Plenty of sunshine means grapes achieve vivid fruit profiles but the cooling influence of the sea and low night time temperatures means the grapes retain all important acidity and freshness.
- The modern wine industry began less than fifty years ago. Sauvignon Blanc is the most widely planted variety, followed by Pinot Noir.






In 1995 New Zealand was the first wine industry to establish a nationwide sustainability programme.

# **SUSTAINABILITY**

Sustainable Winegrowing New Zealand (SWNZ) is a world-leading initiative, with 96% of New Zealand's vineyard producing area certified by the programme.

Under New Zealand Winegrowers' Sustainability Policy, wine must be made from 100% certified grapes in 100% certified winemaking facilities that are independently audited.

Over 10% of wineries in New Zealand are now certified as organic, under globally recognised organic certification programmes.
